Mathematics

Maths Week Scotland 2017

September 2017 saw the inaugural Scottish "Maths Week", and Lesmahagow High School pupils can be very proud of their success!

The Mathematics department was alive with challenges and competitions taking place all week. Pupils learned new problem-solving skills and developed mathematical thinking and numeracy skills that will support learning across the curriculum.

Staff and pupils took part in our 'Prize Problems' competition, with solutions from pupils across the year groups. Well done to everyone! Our prize winners this time were Frazer McCourt (S1), Aimee Balfour (S3), Karen Anderson (S2), David Docherty (S1), Jake Richmond (S2), Kara McLachlan (S1), Elle Grenfell (S2), Mason Shankley (S2) and Willow Murphy (S1). A special mention is deserved by our top three staff winners — Miss Iqbal, Mr Parry and Mr Ross!

During Maths Week, classes were given the opportunity to take part in a national competition run by "Manga High", an online environment in which students practice their skills through games and challenges which dynamically adapt to the learner's abilities and learning needs. Gold, Silver and Bronze awards were won by 275 LHS pupils and, despite fierce competition from schools all over Scotland, we ended the week in the *top 5 schools in the country*. We couldn't be more pleased at the effort LHS pupils put in to this competition. Ten of our pupils - Aaron Meikle, Shantelle Bambrick, Becky McAuley, Megan Frame, Heather Fell, Rachael Troup, Demi Slater, Riyan Siddique, Aneesa Mohammed and Charlie Wilson – earned *over 150 points* and were presented with a certificate, a medal and a share in the school's prize of Amazon vouchers. As if that were not enough, Aaron Meikle and Shantelle Bambrick also finished in the *top ten individual pupils in the whole of Scotland* and were sent an extra prize from Manga High. Well done to all who took part!


