## **SQA Exam Diet 2021/22**

As the SQA Exam Diet 2021/22 begins, I would like to take this opportunity to wish the very best of luck to all of our young people who are sitting exams in the next few weeks.

### **In School Study**

Class teachers are available throughout the exam diet for young people to discuss their exams. Young people should arrange a time to visit their teachers to that they are available. If any young person would like to study in school, then B111 will be available for them to do so. The exception to this is when there is an exam in this rooms, however, an alternative will be provided on the few occasions where this will happen.

### **Uniform**

Whenever seniors are in school during the exam diet, whether studying, visiting a member of staff, or for an exam, they must wear school uniform. This is to ensure the safety of young people in the community and the security of the school.

### **School Bags and Mobile Phones**

School bags and mobile phones are not allowed in the exam hall. Any school bags that are brought to school will be kept in a secure space for the duration of the exam. Mobile phones should be left in bags or alternatively a space in the school office will be provided.

Everything that young people need to know about their exams, including what is allowed in the exam hall, is in the 'Your Exams 2022' booklet which was issued to them prior to the Spring Break. ### **Absence and Timekeeping**

Should a young person be unable to attend any exams, e.g. through illness or a bereavement, then it is extremely important that you contact the office as soon as possible on the morning of the exam.

Individual exam timetables were issued to all young people prior to the Spring Break. This details the exact timings of their exams. Pupils should arrive in plenty of time for the exam starting – at least 10 minutes before the exam starts. Any pupil arriving late may not be allowed to enter the exam hall.
